A Musing from an Alchemy Study Program Student: Griseo?

I'm a Module 1 student in the Alchemy Study Program (ASP) with a question for my brothers and sisters of The Great Art: Why is the "Griseo" Phase not generally recognized or mentioned as a necessary part of the alchemical process?

Although this course is my initial formal learning in alchemy, I've intermittently studied "The Great Art" since receiving my first chemistry set for Christmas. I was 7 years old. 1957.

Dad was a graduate of the University of Pennsylvania, giving me access to some of its outstanding libraries; yet such secrets of alchemy, as the Three Hermetic Pillars--Alchemy, Astrology and Kabbalah, eluded me. Now, as an adult with some degree of experience and learning, the secrets of alchemy continue to be elusive.

In alchemical study I learned that there are four phases or stages to the alchemical process, from the initial Nigredo (black) stage through to the final fourth Rubedo (red) stage. There seems to

be no mention of what I perceive to be a very important initial or null stage prior to the actual operative phases starting with Nigredo. This null stage is what I call the "The Preparation Stage," or Griseo (gray) stage.

September 2010 began my "Griseo" stage for enrolling in the ASP. This phase was a process of prayer, reflection, journaling, re-reading old texts, and figuring the most auspicious date to begin my course work (April 4, 2011). It was a process of gathering resources and preparing myself within and without. Lacking this initial stage, the idea is merely wishful thinking. It is also important to my process that this preparation phase be formally stated.

So I ask you, dear readers, why do we not learn that there are five phases or stages of the alchemical process? I look forward to reading your comments on the IAG member forum: www.alchemyguild.memberlodge.org or if you, too, are a student, on the ASP forum.
